Protocol for the Monitoring of the Performance of the Detachment Commander

Between

The Melancthon Police Services Board

And the Ontario Provincial Police Regional Commander

WHEREAS the Township of Melancthon is required pursuant to Section 4(1) of the <u>Police Services Act</u> to provide adequate and effective police service in accordance with its needs:

AND WHEREAS, the Township of Melancthon has entered into a contract with the Ministry of Public Safety and Security pursuant to Section 10(1) of the <u>Police Services Act</u> for the provision of police services for the Township by the Ontario Provincial Police;

AND WHEREAS, the Township is required pursuant to Section 10(2) of the Police Services Act to have a Police Services Board;

AND WHEREAS, the Melancthon Police Services Board is required pursuant to Subsection 10(9)(d) of the <u>Police Services Act</u> to monitor the performance of the Detachment Commander

THEREFORE THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE THAT

- 1. The Melancthon Police Services Board shall provide the Ontario Provincial Police Regional Commander annually with a report on the performance of the Detachment Commander;
- 2. The report shall indicate the Detachment Commander's performance as it directly relates to the responsibilities of the Board;
- 3. The Board shall include specific examples of unsatisfactory performance.
